However, Israel's resilience is unheralded and another great example of this was the recent successful Israel Allergy Asthma Clinical Immunology meeting held in Zfat this past week. There were several representatives of AFI in attendance including **Dr. William Silver** who spoke on behalf of AFI and gave a talk on Exercise Induced Asthma, **Dr. Marc Rothenberg** who spoke on Eosinophilic Esophagitis and **Dr. Miguel Stein** who presented his work on anti-IL-5 therapy in Eosinophilic Esophagitis completed under the tutelage of his mentor **Dr. Marc Rothenberg**. Last year's honorees of the first annual AFI research awards also presented their data at this meeting. **Dr. Mona Kidon's** abstract was entitled, "Pleiomorphism in the Epitope Specific IgE Response to Mites" and **Dr. Alon Hershko's** abstract was entitled, "Characterization of novel regulatory elements in 3' region of the human IL-10 promoter." We hope to be able to provide two more research awards for next year's IAACI meeting. Also congratulations should be extended to **Menachem Rottem** on his recent appointment as the IAACI President for 2007.

This upcoming year the IAACI and the ACAAI hope to have a combined CME sponsored program in Israel. There may also be an opportunity in the future for a combined IAACI, WAO and AFI meeting in Israel. We will try to keep everyone updated on these events as they evolve. Hopefully, AFI will be able to have significant representation at these meetings.

Dear Jonathan and AFI board members,

I want to thank you and the AFI for the help you had given me in my mini-sabbatical with Prof. Wesley Reeves at the University of Florida last March. As you had asked, I am mailing you a short summary report. I spent time at the Immunology/ Rheumatology clinic which gave me the opportunity to see and discuss tertiary medical center patients with very rare medical conditions and was also able to observe and learn how the research clinic was organized there. I plan on applying some of their methods in my clinic and department in Israel. Also, I attended and actively participated in the Rheumatology and Immunology ward consultations as well as the Division's Journal Clubs/Seminars/Grand Rounds and Scientific meetings.

I was fortunate to make many personal contacts and connections that will help me and other members of my Israeli medical staff in the future. I spent most of my time with Prof. Reeves in his laboratory having many interesting and fruitful discussions along with other staff members and his graduate students. I learned new laboratory methods and actively participated in several experiments looking at Interferon inducible genes in sub-populations of PBMCs obtained from controls and lupus patients using real-time PCR assays. In addition we initiated a new study aimed to look at the genomic DNA level for expression of Interferon inducible genes as well as some other relevant and control genes in PBMC of lupus patients both in the United States and in Israel. I also was involved in immunoprecipitation and ELISA assays that were designed to study autoantibody profiles and their clinical significance in myositis patients. Thus I was successful in establishing and organizing several long-term collaborative research projects between Dr. Reeve's and my own laboratory.

I really believe that the time I spent with Prof. Reeves will enable me to build a strong and fruitful collaboration between our labs. Many thanks again and I hope to see you and other AFI members in Zfat in October.

The Israeli Medical Association (IMA) has, since its establishment in 1912, been a leader in health policy, an advocate for physicians and patients, and the body responsible for the professional and ethical standards of the medical profession in Israel. However, our main goal is to enhance the mutual exchange of physicians so that long-term bonds will form.


We perceive our conference as the highlight of WF activities, and a positive step towards our goals, for it not only allows physicians to become acquainted with the high standard of medicine in Israel but, more importantly, it provides an opportunity for physicians from different continents to come together, share thoughts and discuss common issues of Jewish and medical interest – all under the one roof of the IMA WF.

Attached is a copy of the first announcement of our conference. The conference content will be of a very high standard but the gathering of Jewish physicians from different parts of the globe is no less important. In addition, a membership form is attached, should you be interested in becoming a member of the IMA World Fellowship.

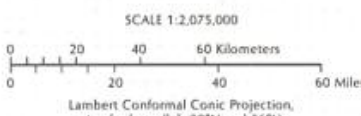
